Winner of the prestigious 2011 Canadian International Organ Competition and currently Associate University Choirmaster and Organist at Harvard University, Christian Lane is one of America's most accomplished and versatile young organists. Consistently acclaimed for his "driving energy and mature interpretation (The American Organist)," he holds a Bachelor's degree and the Sacred Music Diploma from the Eastman School of Music, where his mentor and teacher was David Higgs. Subsequently, he completed graduate work with Thomas Murray as a Robert

Baker Scholar at Yale University, earning a Master's degree from the Yale School of Music and a certificate from Yale's Institute of Sacred Music. Passionate about commissioning new music and using the organ in collaborative settings, Mr. Lane has performed extensively throughout the United States and in Europe. Notably, he premiered two commissioned works by composer Nico Muhly and he regularly performs joint programs with internationally acclaimed soprano Jolle Greenleaf. As an accompanist, he has recorded several discs with choirs, including three last year with Harvard ensembles; his first two solo discs are forthcoming this year. In addition, Mr. Lane has been privileged to serve within several of the United States' most prominent parish music programs prior to, and including, his 2008 appointment at Harvard. Included are the Episcopal Churches of Trinity-on-the-Green (New Haven) and Saint Thomas Fifth Avenue (New York City).
