James Kibbie is Associate Professor of Organ at the University of Michigan. He performs numerous recitals throughout the nation and travels to Europe frequently for concert, recording, and festival engagements. His performances have been broadcast on radio and television in the U.S., Canada, and Europe. He has been awarded the Grand Prix d'Interpretation at the Concours International "Grand Prix de Chartres" and is also the only organist from a Western nation to have won the International Organ Competition of the Prague Spring Festival in Czechoslovakia. His recording credits include works of Buxtehude, Alain, Tournemire, and 20th-century Czech composers. Recipient of the Doctor of Musical Arts Degree from the University of Michigan, his teachers have included Marilyn Mason and Donald Willing.

Dr. Kibbie currently serves as consultant on acoustics and organ design to the Archdiocese of Detroit. He also directs the University of Michigan's annual Conferences on Organ Music and International Organ Performance Competitions, held each October in Ann Arbor.
